Maximize the return on the state's investments in biomedical research and technology










National Cancer Institute (NCI) Designation

National Cancer Institute (NCI) Designation - Florida

At the creation of this Florida program, the primary goal was to provide support for UF Health and Sylvester to obtain NCI designation, and for Moffitt to sustain NCI Comprehensive designation by investing in Florida's cancer centers.



Moffitt, an NCI-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center, re-applied for designation on 1/25/21. A site visit is scheduled for 5/4/21.



Sylvester achieved NCI designation in July 2019, becoming the 71st designated Cancer Center and the 2nd in Florida. Sylvester will re-apply for designation in 2024.




<u>UF Health</u> submitted its first NCI application in 2019. Was recommended for designation by the review committees; however, NCI declined approval for designation. UF Health is planning to re-apply in 2022.

The Florida Academic Cancer Center Alliance (FACCA) Accomplishments


The Florida Academic Cancer Center Alliance (FACCA) was formed in 2014 to build collaborations between the three centers to expedite innovation in cancer research throughout the State of Florida and maximize the return on the state's investments in biomedical research and technology.







Garnered over \$581 million in peer-reviewed funds in the last 6 years



- Completed 45,706 training experiences for current and future clinicians and scientists.
- Increased the number of patients enrolled on cancer clinical trials by 136%
- Provided treatment to 67,174 newly diagnosed patients in the last 3 years



Over the last three years, recruited notable research faculty (primarily from out of state), competing successfully for top-tier scientists against larger, more established institutions including: MD Anderson, Harvard & the Cleveland Clinic



Investments in the clinical research infrastructure have led to dramatic increases in patients accrued to interventional accruals, with more than 50% of Sylvester's total accruals representing racial/ethnic minorities.



UF Health was recognized as a Center of Excellence by the National Pancreas Foundation, one of only 28 centers in the nation.



Florida Academic Cancer Center Alliance (FACCA) Collaborations



 Creation of 'The Florida Pancreas Cancer Collaborative', a FACCA funded pilot partnership dedicated to the <u>prevention and early detection</u> of pancreatic cancer which includes scientists from all 3 centers



 Over 75 collaborative scientific publications featuring members of at least two FACCA institutions, in the past 3 years



Since 2015, collaboratively, the centers have been awarded
 19 pilot grants for inter-institutional projects



- Funded 2 think tanks in the areas of the microbiome and health disparities
- Launching 2 think tanks in the areas of immunotherapy and epigenetics
